

Q. Well, I wouldn't like to say... sounds disgusting!


A. As I suspected, you're a spy. Probably a landlubber sent by the Navy to find my whereabouts. They've been after Blackbeard for years...

Q, But IS BLACKBIRD YOUR REAL NAME?

A.No, it's Black*beard*. Men, throw this troublemaker in the hold. We'll use him for bait when we meet some sharks, ha.

Q, What about Edward Teach?

A. WAIT! Leave him. Where did you hear that name? Who are you really?



Q. OK, time to tell the truth. My name is Andy and I'm from 200 years in the future and I've timetravelled here to interview you for a book. You're the one pirate everybody's heard of!

A. HAHAHAHA! Now THAT is a story! Well, spy or nay, you can certainly entertain the crew with crazy tales like that when we are out on the ocean.

- Q. Perhaps you'll believe me if I tell you that you are from Bristol but became a privateer, running a boat out here in the West Indies, raiding Spanish ships for the British Government while the two countries were at war? You also lived on Jamaica for a time before visiting the Republic of Pirates in Nassau where you sailed with Benjamin Hornigold. True or not?
- A.So, mysterious stranger, you know my story well, a small part of it – perhaps I should believe you. Or maybe I should just save myself the trouble and throw you overboard. What do you want to know?
- Q. I want to know how you became a pirate and what it's like, and if the stories about you in books are true. This is your chance to set the record straight, dispel the myths! Will you do it?
- A. Well, why not. I can tell my story and still throw you into the sea if I feel like it... go ahead with your questions, Andrew of Tomorrowland.
- Q. Ah, thank you, finally. Right, so why did you become a pirate?
- A. Why indeed... it's a dishonest and dangerous life but an exciting one. It beats sitting behind a desk in some dusty town... Like you said, ten years ago I was out here in the Caribbean, commanding a fast, well-armed sloop and capturing Spanish treasures from ships sailing from their colonies. I loved the life of a privateer, and I had the blessing of good Queen Anne too.

- Q. Oh right, you mean you captured boats going from America to Spain so what was the treasure? Gold and jewels?
- A.Occasionally gold, often silver. But there are other kinds of treasure out here in the West Indies: sugar, wine, rum, cocoa, cotton, indigo dye they are worth good money.



- Q. So, you were a kind of legalised pirate because England was at war with Spain and France, fighting over who would control Europe and which colonies in America would belong to which country?
- A.It was a bit more complicated than that, but yes.

 Then the war ended in 1713 and I was out here. I didn't want to go back and live in Jamaica or cold, damp Britain. I enjoyed the life at sea, I was a good sailor and the men trusted me. Besides, we had guns and cannon and the Spanish merchant ships were still loaded with rich cargoes...

Q. You carried on robbing them then?

A. Well, not at first. I thought about becoming a slave trader but then I heard about this island in the Bahamas controlled by pirates. There were stories about it everywhere. The Republic of Pirates. I had to go and see for myself.

Q, What was it like?

A. Lawless, rough, treacherous... There was too much chance of having your throat slit in a place like that. Instead, I joined the crew of a crafty skipper, Ben Hornigold. We soon captured some vessels and he gave one to me to command. We sailed together and plundered Spanish goods.



Q. What did you do with the captured ships? Jump aboard and murder the crew?

A.Ah, so you don't know everything... No, my lad, that is not my way. I split from Hornigold after a while. My men said we should loot *every* ship, even the British. By this time, I had a bigger craft with more guns, the *Revenge*. I led a bold crew, with three boats in all. And I learned there was no need for bloodshed.

Q. How? What? I thought you were a vicious, evil brute?

A.Ha, then you are mistaken! I am a big man but I also wore imposing clothes, a tall hat and I grew my dark beard long and had it plaited. We flew black flags with death heads in them. I looked like a terror, a fearsome sight, and that was enough...

Q. What do you mean?

A. When sailors on captured ships saw
me, they said I was a devil! They were
convinced I was going to kill them all, especially
as I always wore six pistols. So they just
handed over their cargoes without a fight. Easy!
Especially when I added a bit of fire...

Q. Fire?

A. Yes, I tucked some lit fuses into my hat where they hung down, spitting sparks and smoke. That really convinced them I was more demon than man. But I never killed anyone.

Q. And did you ever say, 'Me hearties'?

Q, 'Shiver me timbers'?

A.Eh?

Q. I won't mention 'pieces of eight'.

A. Good. What else do you want to know?

Q. Why are you so secretive about your real name?

A. You may think I'm just a filthy pirate robber, but I am an educated man from a good family. I want to protect them in case I am captured. I don't want them to be blamed for my misdeeds.

Q. So, you know what you are doing is wrong?

A.Of course! It's stealing. But where did this treasure come from? The Spanish have looted the American lands to the south for centuries. They invaded and just took whatever they wanted from the local people. The British and French did the same. And they put slaves to work all over these islands in the West Indies, growing sugar. They grew rich from

all of that. So I have taken some of their ill-gotten wealth.

Q. Right, I see. This ship must be full of money. Are you going to bury it?

A. What, bury a ship? That would be a BIG hole...

Q. No, I mean... oh never mind, I know you're going to tell me pirates don't bury treasure, so I won't ask. What ship is this, by the way?

A. The Queen Anne's Revenge. I captured it from the French and added 40 cannons. Of course, our dear queen is dead now and we have some German called George on the throne. PAH.

Q. So, what are your plans next?

A.As you can see, I now have several vessels at my command, enough to blockade a port in the colonies.

Q. What does that mean?

A. We're heading for South Carolina, on the American coast. There's a town there called Charleston. My ships are going to block the harbour and rob anyone sailing in or out. Easy pickings. But what I really want are medicines.


Q. Are you ill? Fuse burns, maybe? Scurvy? Wooden leg rash?
