a Size-o-riser!"

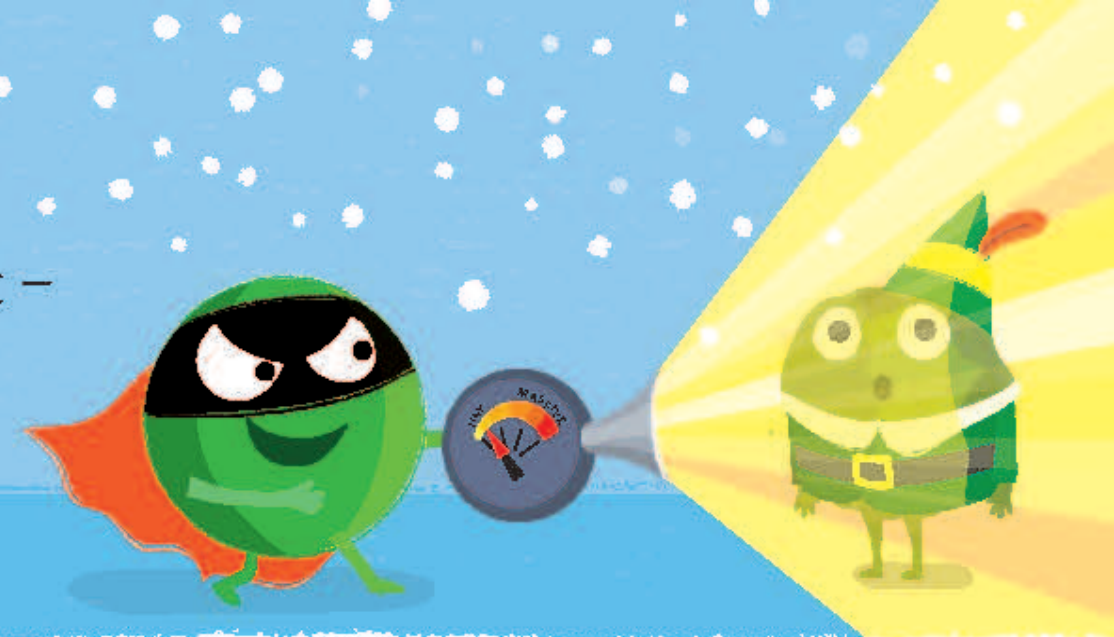
"Oooh, what does it do?" asked Carrot.
