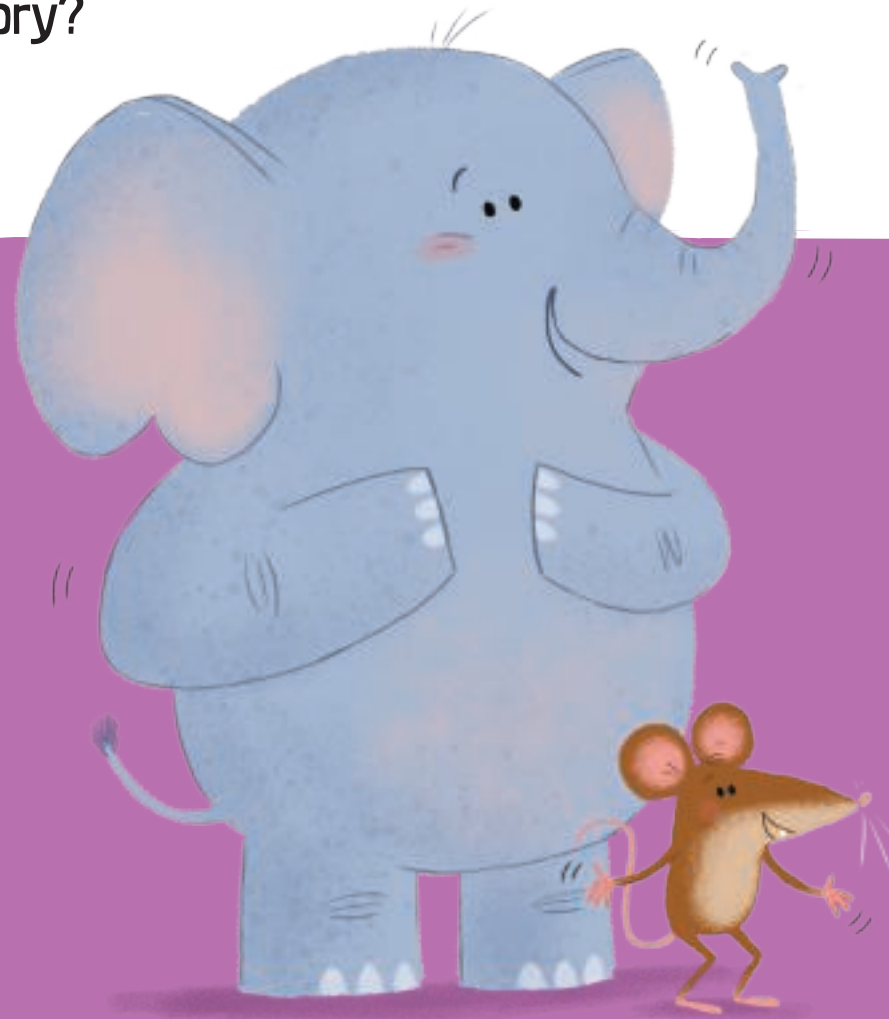


Reading with your child

blurb. Talk about what
the word 'float' means.



During reading

- Encourage your child to describe what is going on in the pictures.
- Ask your child what is happening, and what they think might happen next.
- When you turn the page to see what actually happens, the outcome may or may not be what you expect! Talk about it.
- Give them lots of praise as you go along!
