

SUPER STINKY FACTS!

Ring-tailed Lemurs use scent to mark their territory. They rub their tails on their scent glands until they're nice and smelly, then they wave them in the air. The stinkier the better.



Small but deadly, Millipedes can release a stinky poisonous spray. The spray from 100 giant millipedes is strong enough to kill a person. Eek!



If a Lesser Anteater feels threatened, it lets rip a smelly spray, five times stinkier than a skunk's - and that's saying something!



Unlike most birds, the Hoatzin (or Stinkbird) mainly eats leaves. All this leaf-munching takes lots of digesting - resulting in a yucky poo-like smell! Salad, anyone?



The Skunk has a very powerful weapon... stink clouds. With two stink squirters next to its bottom, fired by strong muscles, a skunk's aim is dangerously accurate.



There are over 5,000 different types of Stink Bug. But they have one thing in common - get too close and they'll spray a disgusting smelly liquid at you!



This enormous Giant Pelican Flower smells like rotting meat. An irresistible smell for the average fly... Yum!

Slow-moving Sloths are covered in algae. It's a bit smelly - but it makes the perfect home for all sorts of bugs. Over 900 beetles were once found on a single sloth.
